### AgeUk in Brighstone



Eighteen months ago, St Mary's Church contracted an AgeUKIW Community Development Officer, Judith Stratton, to work in the Five Parishes helping to set up activities and services to reduce isolation and loneliness in the older population.

One of the activities she facilitated was the Coffee Morning at the Methodist Chapel and in August they celebrated their first anniversary with a garden party. Over 80 visitors were served cream teas by Chapel and AgeUKIW volunteers and staff, including two rather eccentric chefs (Avice Mariner and Terry Hack). Local crooner, Alan Rodway, provided excellent entertainment by singing a set of Frank Sinatra songs and in spite of rather damp weather people were soon dancing in the car park as umbrellas and sun hats kept off the worst of the rain!

Many people took advantage of having their photos taken dressed in Hawaiian skirts and leis in front of a beach scene, go to the Five Parishes website to see the gallery. A raffle raised £73 for the Brighstone Newsletter. If you have not visited the coffee morning yet please do pop by, it's held every Tuesday 10 - 12noon in the Methodist Chapel.

St Mary's Church have funded this community project since March 2014 at a cost of £14,000.00 per annum. The Church committed funding for 2 years and this will come to an end next March unless further funds can be found.
